CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 10

effective Jan 27, 1981

A CHARTER ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 7 OF CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 9 RELATING TO PRIMARY ELECTIONS FOR CITY OFFICES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF MERRIAM, KANSAS:

Section 1. Section 7 of Charter Ordinance No. 9 is hereby repealed.

Section 2. This Charter Ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official City newspaper.

Section 3. This Charter Ordinance shall take effect sixty-one (61) days after its final publication, unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed as provided for in Article XII, Section 5, Subsection C-3 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, in which case the ordinance shall become effective upon approval by a majority of electors voting thereon.

PASSED by the Governing Body of the City of Merriam, Kansas by not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the members - elect voting in favor thereof this 17th day of November, 1980.

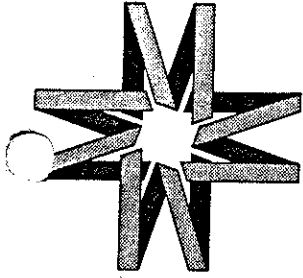
