**EMERGENCY ORDER OF LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER**

Emergency Public Health Order issued on this 22nd day of March 2020 to mitigate the spread of the Coronavirus (CO V ID-19) epidemic in Johnson County, Kansas, pursuant to the authority provided in K.S.A. 65-119, K.S.A. 65-129b and K.S.A. 65-202 and other applicable laws or regulations.

**Section Two.**

Essential Businesses shall take proactive measures to ensure compliance with Social Distancing Requirements, including where possible:

- i. Designate six-foot distances. Designating with signage, tape, or by other means six-foot spacing for employees and customers in line to maintain appropriate distance;
- ii. Hand sanitizer and sanitizing products. Having anti-microbial soap and water or hand sanitizer and sanitizing products readily available for employees and customers;
- iii. Separate operating hours for vulnerable populations. Implementing separate operating hours for elderly and vulnerable customers; and
- iv. Online and remote access. Posting online whether a facility is open and how best to reach the facility and continue services by phone or remotely.
