Synopsis

March 1st– The Fabelmans: Director Steven Spielberg takes a fond look back at his Arizona childhood in this semi-autobiographical portrait, revisiting the characters, locations and events that would ultimately inspire many of the director's best-loved films.

March 8th– Finding Steve McQueen: Inspired by the true story of the biggest bank heist of all time, Harry Barber recounts how in 1972 a gang of close-knit thieves from Youngstown, Ohio attempted to steal \$30 Million in illegal campaign contributions from President Richard Nixon's secret fund. But the plan quickly goes sideways, prompting the biggest manhunt in FBI history with more than 125 agents assigned to the case.

March 15th– TAR: In the male-dominated world of classical music, Lydia Tár is a star. But as the first female director of a major orchestra prepares to record a symphony, she confronts the changing nature of power, its impact, and durability in our modern world.

March 22nd– The Duke: In 1961, Kempton Bunton, a 60-year old taxi driver, stole Goya's portrait of the Duke of Wellington from the National Gallery in London. It was the first (and remains the only) theft in the Gallery's history. Kempton sent ransom notes saying that he would return the painting on condition that the government agreed to provide television for free to the elderly. What happened next became the stuff of legend. Only 50 years later did the full story emerge – a startling revelation of how a good man set out to change the world and in so doing saved his son and his marriage to Dorothy Bunton.

March 29th– Devotion: Korean War fighter pilots Tom Hudner and Jesse L. Brown form life-and-death bonds after one of them is shot down in enemy territory, forcing the other flier to rely on extreme tactics to rescue his brother-in-arms.

April 5th– Whitney Houston: I Wanna Dance With Somebody: This triumphant celebration of the incomparable Whitney Houston is the untold story of the complex and multifaceted woman behind the voice. From New Jersey choir girl to one of the best-selling and most awarded recording artists of all time, follow the inspirational and poignant journey through Houston's trailblazing life and career.

April 12th– Armageddon Time: In 1980s Queens, New York, 12-year-old Paul and his best friend, John, are inseparable. But when the two get into trouble, Paul's parents enroll him in a private school where he is forced to confront unfamiliar issues of race and class.

April 19th– The Banshees of Inisherin: On a small Irish isle in the early 1920s, folk musician Colm Doherty decided he was weary of the company of longtime, affable but dull drinking buddy Padraic Suilleabhain-and told him so. The hurt Padraic's insistent efforts to get back in Colm's good graces take a series of bizarrely violent turns that put their tiny community up in arms.

April 26th– A Man Called Otto: Widowed and retired, Otto Anderson spreads ill will throughout his community by criticizing and judging all those who live around him. But when a boisterous family moves in next door, they worm their way into his life and heart.
