- An occupational license is required if your business is located in Merriam or you're doing business within City limits.
- Before signing a lease or purchasing a building, call to confirm that your business is compatible with building and zoning codes for your proposed location.
- New or modified commercial signage requires a Merriam signage permit.
- Building permits are required for new construction, parking lot installation/ modification, building repair or modification (electrical, mechanical or plumbing), roof repair/installation, and/or changing the occupancy or intensity of your building space. Contact Community Development before starting your project.


